# A BIO-SECURITY CLEAN HULL PASS WILL BE NECESSARY.

- > A CLEAN HULL certificate is required visiting most Northland Harbours.
- > A CLEAN HULL certificate is required visiting Northland Island Sanctuaries.
- A Northland CLEAN HULL certificate shows proof of anti-fouling in the last 6 months or a hull clean in the last month ('6 in 1 rule').
- Boats on Moorings & Marinas in Auckland are checked for excessive growth and marine pests.
- Non-compliant boats will receive a warning notice.
- Many marinas DO NOT allow the use of divers to clean boat hulls.
  - A non-compliant boat cannot be moved until cleaned!

- There is a lack of sufficient haul-out facilities in Auckland!
- Waiting lists at all existing haul-out facilities!
- Existing facilities in Auckland, to ensure compliance with Auckland's & Northland's Bio-security Laws, are insufficient to cater for peak demand.

- 25 March 2023




#### George Day






